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It takes a village to move the needle.

The City of Richmond's children are facing challenges that can affect their entire lives.

- 41.5% are impacted by poverty.
- 57% of Richmond's kindergarteners do not meet school-readiness benchmarks compared to 42% in Virginia overall
- Only 47% of students in Richmond passed the state reading assessment in 2021-22, compared to 73% in Virginia overall.

Children who are not reading proficiently in 3rd grade are four times more likely to drop out of high school, and <u>black and</u> <u>Hispanic students living in poverty who are not proficient readers are eight times more likely than proficient readers to drop</u> <u>out of high school.</u>





Dolly Parton's Imagination Library (DPIL)

Imagination Library reaches more children than any other early childhood book gifting program, and mails free, high-quality, age-appropriate books to children from birth until age five, no matter their family's income.






